	The second RFP is for contracts to provide school prevention/intervention services targeting youth-at-risk of becoming harmfully involved with alcohol or other drugs or are experiencing serious social/emotional problems. Snohomish County is also seeking proposals for contracts implementing wellness programs into existing chemical dependency or mental health treatment programs. An applicant's conference is scheduled for January 8 th , and proposals are due to the county by February 2 nd .
