Call to Order and Introductions - Chair Johnson

The Chair called the meeting to order and initiated introductions

Revisions to the Agenda – Chair Johnson

The Chair asked if there were revisions to the Agenda, there were none

Comments & Announcements from the Chair

Chair Johnson said the groundbreaking ceremony for the new facility went well. The foundation is anticipated to be poured within the next week.

Reports from Members

Snohomish County

Cammy Hart-Anderson: Snohomish County received an invitation from Accountable Community of Health (ACH) to participate in a phone call to expand trauma informed care practices throughout the region. Other counties in the region had representatives on the call. Snohomish County has Trauma Informed Services in 30 schools, 10 school districts and 40 community agencies. Snohomish county is in the process of becoming trauma informed as a department.

Whatcom County

Regina Delahunt: The governor visited Whatcom County last week. Talks took place about the funding for the crisis stabilization facilities. The Governor seemed to understand the county's dilemma; his staff were taking copious notes and informed Whatcom County that they would look into the concerns and noted this is not what they had intended.

Whatcom County

 Anne Deacon: The county stepped in to assist one of the school districts, a Drug Free Community Grant was awarded; the county is now receiving thank you cards.

San Juan County

Barbara Labrash: Orcas Island Prevention Coalition was awarded a Drug Free Community Grant; \$625,00 over 3 years.

Skagit County

- Ken Dahlstedt: The work is continuing on the Evaluation and Treatment Facility project.
- There was another recent school shooting. The county is working with the schools to continue to provide mental health workers in the school system.

Island County

o Jill Johnson: Island county is using some of their $1/10^{th}$ of 1% monies for school based mental health counselors. One of the school districts hired the county's mental health worker, which is positive. Island County has been very present in the schools and wants to ensure they have the financial tools to meet the mental health needs of the kids.

Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH)

Summary:

PATH is a federal grant providing outreach to individuals who are homeless and in need of services. The team engages and refers individuals for services they qualify for or are entitled to, such as Veterans Benefits. This program has a team in Snohomish and Whatcom County, both teams are attached to Compass Health. Both contracts require a local match of 33.33%, Compass Health is currently working on finding the match for both projects.

Motion #19-63

- Health Care Authority-North Sound BH-ASO-Snohomish PATH-19-20 providing homeless outreach in Snohomish County with a maximum consideration of \$167,256 with a term of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020.

■ North Sound BH-ASO-Compass Health-PATH-19-20 providing homeless outreach in Snohomish and Whatcom Counties with a maximum consideration of \$219,017 with a term of October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020.

This motion was tabled until North Sound BH-ASO can receive further clarification regarding the matching funds. It will be discussed again during the December meeting.

Professional Service Agreement

Summary:

Dr. Glenn Lippman is our contracted Consultant Medical Director. Health Care Authority requires the North Sound BH-ASO to have a Medical Director. Dr. Lippman is available for telephone consultation for up to five (5) hours per week.

Motion #19-65

North Sound BH-ASO-G. Lippman M.D.-PSC-20 for the provision of consulting Medical Director services. The maximum consideration on the contract is \$45,000 with a term of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020. Ken Dahlstedt moved the motion for approval, Barbara LaBrash seconded, all in favor, motion #19-65 carried.

Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness (PATH)

- Health Care Authority-North Sound BH-ASO-Whatcom PATH-17-19 Amendment 2 providing homeless outreach in Whatcom County with an increase of \$12,940 for a maximum consideration of \$108,651 with a term of July 1, 2017 through September 30, 2019.

Barbara LaBrash moved the motion for approval, Anne Deacon seconded, Darcy Cheesman opposed, Russell Wiita abstained, motion #19-66 carried, due to majority vote.

Motion #19-67

North Sound BH-ASO-Compass Health-PATH-17-19 Amendment providing homeless outreach in Snohomish and Whatcom Counties with an increase of \$54,756 for a maximum consideration of \$219,026 with a term of July 1, 201 through September 30, 2019.

No action was taken on this motion. It will be added to the December Action Items after clarification is received.
